#### Overview

- Passed in March
- Washington cities will receive approximately \$1.1 billion over two years.
- 98% of Washington cities accepted ARPA funds
- Cities have until December 31, 2024, to obligate funds December 31, 2026, to spend funds.



- Remember Federal Delegations


### How can funds be spent?

- 1. Public health response to COVID-19 emergency
- 2. Address the negative economic impacts caused by the public health emergency (public assistance)
- 3. Replace lost public sector revenue
- 4. Provide premium pay for essential workers
- 5. Invest in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure
- 6. Administrative costs
