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Clean Buildings Performance Standard

- Based on ASHRAE Standard 100-2018
- WAC 194-50 Rules for compliance and administrative requirements.
 - Amendment to Standard 100


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
- · Tier 1 Buildings
 - · Buildings over 50k sq ft excluding parking
- · Tier 2 Buildings
 - Buildings between 20k and 50k sq ft excluding parking Multifamily over 20k sq ft excluding parking




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















Criteria

- · No Certificate of Occupancy
- Less than 50% occupancy
- At least 50% of the conditioned floor area is unoccupied
- More than 50,000(Tier 1)/20,000(Tier 2) sq ft of floor area unconditioned/semi conditioned
- More than 50% of floor area designated as Factory Group F or High Hazard Group H
- · Agricultural structures
- · Building is pending demolition
- Financial hardship

· Exemption Application Timeframe.

- Tier 1 applications- no sooner than 3 years prior to the compliance date and no later than 180 days prior to the compliance date.
- Tier 2 applications- no sooner than 2 years prior to the compliance date and no later than 180 days prior to the compliance date.
- Exemption Certificate Validity. Exemptions certificates are only valid for the current compliance review cycle.

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Penalties

- Tier 1
 - Up to \$1.50/SF + \$5,000
- Tier 2
 - Administrative penalty not to exceed \$0.30/SF

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CBPS Incentive Program

Tier 1

- Program launches July 1, 2021
- Program application ends
 - June 1, 2025 for buildings >220k
 - June 1, 2026 for buildings >90k to 220k
 - June 1, 2027 for buildings >50k to 90k
- \$75 million available for incentives
- \$0.85 cents per gross square foot

Tier 2

- Program launches July 1, 2025 and ends June 1, 2030
- \$150 million available for incentives
- \$0.30 cents per gross square foot

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CBPS Incentive Program

Tier 1- Requirements

- At least 50,000sf
- Building must be 15 EUI above target
- Building must be served by at least 1 participating utility company
- Building must be in full compliance with CBPS and meet it's EUIt

Tier 2- Requirements

- At least 20,000sf
- Building meets O&M and EMP requirements of CBPS
- Program under development

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Energy Audit for Public Buildings

- Exclusively for public buildings- city, county, state, etc...
- \$.50+/SF
- Can retroactively pay if an audit was after July 2023

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

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Supplemental capital budget

Clean Buildings Performance Grants (91002451)

The appropriation in this section is subject to the following conditions and limitations:

- \$25,000,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided solely for clean building performance grants for tier 1 covered buildings as
 defined in RCW 19.27A.200.
- \$15,427,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided solely for clean building performance grants for public buildings.
- \$3,050,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided solely for the Spokane public facilities district.
- \$773,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided solely for Spokane county energy efficiency upgrades.
- \$750,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided solely for Tacoma fleet maintenance building decarbonization.

This section takes effect January 1, 2025. If the climate commitment account is repealed as of December 30, 2024, then this section is null and void on December 31, 2024. 5949-S.SL.pdf (wa.gov)
