Partnership for Our Food Security Who we are.

The Partnership for Food Security is a voluntary association of individuals and organizations to fight the COVID 19 virus attacks on the people and communities who plant, grow, raise, harvest, feed, transport, store, process and bring us our food. (See a list of Partners below)

These workers often live and work in rural cities and communities in Washington. Farms in our state employ a large influx of guest workers under the federal H2A program. Many of them live with extended families, making widely available and non-age-restricted vaccination all the more critical. Churches often occupy a vital place in their lives. A large proportion of these workers and communities are Latino.

The approach to vaccinating people who produce and deliver food in our state needs to continue to be strengthened and rapidly expanded by both vaccine delivery and an educational component to continue dialogue on the safety and importance of the COVID-19 vaccine with the community members.

This pilot program has been adapted to these communities to meet people where they are. Our aim is to build on existing efforts in already trusted areas, not recreate them or impede existing efforts.

Cities are in a unique position to support these efforts by providing vaccination sites in trusted gathering areas for H2A and guest workers as well as farm employees. Cities may also be able to aid in decreasing vaccine hesitancy by working with trusted community organizations to create meaningful and timely information on COVID-19 vaccine safety.

This pilot project began with a primary focus in Central Washington, due to the virus' large presence in the region. This made vaccines accessibility all the more important due to the yearly increase of guest and H2A workers in Central and Eastern WA. However, **this is a statewide issue that continues to affect communities across the state**.

Now that COVID -19 has largely been contained in many areas in Washinton, the **Partners'** goal is to continue to offer culturally competent and accessible vaccines and testing to under-served communities across Washington.
